## Duluth New Dawn gets 'Coarse' in Duluth

DULUTH - Sherry Ingbritsen said New Dawn Theatre is trying something a little different.

When the company gathered together to decide what they should perform for their debut season as New Dawn Theatre, Ingbritsen as theatre president said they wanted to make sure they had a good "shuffle."

"We wanted to try to do shows that we have not done before," she said.

The company decided on "A Coarse Acting Show" written by Michael Green. Ingbritsen said it is not performed very often.

"It's a great play," she said, "but it's a lot of work."

The play clocks in at just under two hours, has four movable sets and includes several different scripts.

"It's a play where anything can happen," she said. "There is constantly something going on."

With so much going on, what is the play about?

"It's an actor's nightmare," she said, "but it's something that you as the audience can relate to. All the things that could go wrong on a serious show, does go wrong. What could be serious, is funny."

For example, the classic novel "Moby Dick" is condensed to about 15 minutes. And, the production includes a whale.

"We actually do have a whale," she said. "The audience can expect anything with this show."

Ingbritsen said this has been a "wonderful cast to work with."

Ingbritsen said the shows have gone well for the theatre since it started earlier this year.
